

Andrew is a Consultant Anaesthetist at Manchester Royal Infirmary (Manchester University NHS Foundation Trust)

He qualified in Medicine from the University of Newcastle-upon-Tyne in 1998, remaining in the North-East until 2002, completing Basic Surgical Training, before moving to Manchester, via 6-months at Alder Hey, to start anaesthetic training. Appointed Consultant initially at North Manchester General Hospital in 2009, before transferring to Manchester Royal Infirmary in 2014.

His main interests are anaesthetic allergies; he runs the North-West regional Anaesthetic Reaction Clinic investigating suspected cases of perioperative anaphylaxis and collaborator with the UK Fatal Anaphylaxis Registry; anaesthesia for hepatobiliary surgery, and pre-operative assessment. He is the lead trainer in critical incident simulation training for the Trust's foundation doctors. He is an examiner for the Primary FRCA examinations, and lead for the pharmacology section of the written exam.

Outside work Andrew is an enthusiastic singer in a band and a long-suffering follower of Newcastle United.
